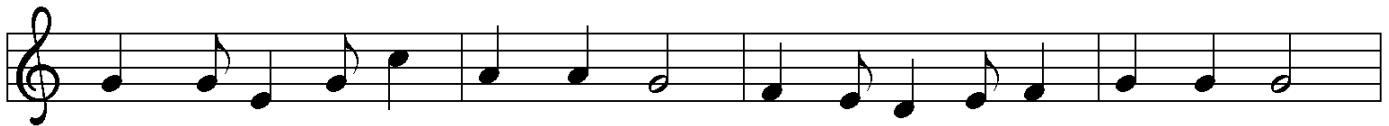
PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION
